

Professor Milovan Antić graduated medical studies in 1944 (Sofia) and completed internal medicine specialization in 1952 (Belgrade). His professional training in nuclear medicine took a place in Paris and London. After specialization, he joined The Military Medical Academy and in 1959 became a Head of a newly founded Department which was later transformed into The Institute of Nuclear Medicine. Apart from health care, he was widely engaged in nuclear medicine staff education and in 1973 acquired the degree of a professor. His scientific work resulted in 156 articles published in well - known medical journals and books.

He also ran nuclear medicine organization, in the capacity of its founder and President of Nuclear Medicine Section (involved in Serbian Medical Society), as well as a long-time member of the Presidency of newly established Yugoslav Society of Nuclear Medicine.

Professor Milovan Antić was a pioneer of nuclear medicine in Serbia and Yugoslavia. Initial radioisotope application in patients diagnostics and therapy, as well as researches were linked to his activities. The whole professional carrier of Prof. Milovan Antić was fulfilled with transferring his huge knowledge to numerous generations of various staff profiles working in the field of nuclear medicine laboratories.

His professional, teaching and scientific work was very precious for nuclear medicine development throughout all these regions. Human nature and generosity of Professor Milovan Antić will be forever remembered by his patients and successors.

The SNMS award bearing his name was established for authors of scientific articles to motivate current and new coming nuclear medicine generations to follow the scientific path traced by Prof. Milovan Antić.
